K. UNFINISHED BUSINESS

- 1. 2018 Weed Management
 - Lyn Patrick, 292 1st St. spoke in favor of organic weed management, worked on the Town IPM and suggested reviewing the document, Ridgeway is pesticide free, requested citizen participation in weed management in the form of a committee
 - Marianne Hurley, 545 W. Grand Ave. spoke in favor of organic weed management, she participated in weed pulling and feels that most are medicinal herbs, she requested reconsidering the definition of weeds and to consider what kids put in their mouth
 - Emily Palmer, 39303 Road J spoke in favor of organic weed management, she lives on the river and is concerned about pesticides going into the river, she has the same concerns as the other speakers, questioned why we have to spray,
 - Peter Brind'Amour, 325 E. 1st St. spoke in favor of organic weed management, thanked Terry for his work on this topic, human health vs aesthetic balance doesn't make sense, would like the Town to continue using organic methods rather than spraying

The 2018 budget includes \$5,000 for weed management. Currently, lawn maintenance in Boyle Park is done by using a core aerator, over seeding, and cutting the grass at a height of 3 ½ inches to help crowd out weeds in addition to hand pulling thistle as needed. The quote for a 100% OMRI Certified lawn care program for Boyle Park was \$14,000 per year. A combination of organic based and traditional weed & Feed is approximately \$8,000 per year. Traditional weed and feed only is approximately \$2,200 per year. The Board directed staff to utilize traditional weed and feed in Boyle Park.

L. NEW BUSINESS

1. 2018 Second Round Agency Contributions

The Town of Mancos has received four requests from area organizations for the second round of agency contributions in 2018. The total amount requested is \$4,500. Trustee Ed Hallam made the motion to make the following awards:

3. Streets Paving

The Town of Mancos 2018 budget includes \$111,000 for streets paving. We are planning to pave Walnut St. from Bauer to Railroad by the Post Office and Park Street. Beech Street by Mancos School was originally included in the budget, but this has been postponed due to the school construction project. Trustee Cindy Simpson made the motion to authorize the Town Administrator to accept the bid from Oldcastle SW Group Inc in the amount of \$75,200 for streets paving. Trustee Ed Hallam seconded the motion. Motion passed unanimously by roll call vote.

5. Electric Vehicle Charging Station Discussion

Staff has been researching the possibility of installing one or more EV charging stations in Boyle Park. Staff was directed to move forward with researching costs and funding options for this project.
