#### **PART 3: DETAILED INFORMATION:**

### **1. A. Mission Statement**

The mission of our organization is to help residents of Montezuma and Dolores counties (men, women, and children) with costs associated with a cancer diagnosis. These costs can include medical and non-medical expenses. In addition, our organization continues to educate the public about cancer and provide free breast and reproductive cancer screenings for women through our providers. In accordance with our mission, the Cancer Resource Alliance program provides grants up to \$750 to help residents in Montezuma and Dolores counties with their expenses, both medical and non-medical.

#### **1.B.** Goals and Objectives

**Goal:** Our goal is to increase awareness of our program and be able to increase grants to \$1,000 and provide more assistance to residents of Montezuma and Dolores counties dealing with a cancer diagnosis.

**Objective:** To increase funds raised through Pretty in Pink and "round-up" campaigns, and to seek applicable grants.

### 2. A. Purpose of Requested Funds

Funds will be used for grants up to \$750 to individuals in Montezuma and Dolores Counties with a cancer diagnosis. These funds can be used for medical and/or nonmedical expenses. The Cancer Resource Alliance has no paid staff and very minimal administrative expenses. In 2022 only \$1050 was expended on administrative items (postage, envelopes, P.O. Box rental, rack card printing, website maintenance, etc.)

### 2. B. Geographical location of where funds will be expended

Funds are available to all residents of Montezuma and Dolores Counties. Percentages below reflect the actual distribution of grants from January 1, 2022 through December, 2022.

- 10% Mancos (81328 zip code)
- 84% Montezuma County
- 6% Dolores County

As of 2021 statistics, those with a zip code of 81328 represent 14% of Montezuma County's population.

### 2. C. Why is it critical you receive this funding

As of 7/31/23 we have awarded 66 assistance grants. This is almost double the requests funded in 2022 during the same period. We funded a total of 70 applications in 2022 and we are well on our way to exceeding that number. Awareness of and demand for our program continues to increase. In 2022, however, funds raised at our annual Pretty in Pink fundraiser were lower than expected. Only \$11,735 was raised at the event (as compared to \$20,500 in 2121). This funding shortfall coupled with the dramatic increase in applicants has hampered our ability to fund grant requests. Currently we have reduced grants from \$750 to \$600 and have put a hold on grants to repeat applicants (residents with a cancer diagnosis can apply once every calendar year for assistance).

## 3. How will funding of your organization's activities met the Board of Trustees funding priorities?

The Cancer Resource Alliance meets the funding priorities of the Mancos Town Council because:

- 1. We have 501(c)(3) nonprofit status (see attached documentation).
- 2. By providing funds to assist residents undergoing cancer treatment with medical and non-medical expenses we meet the unique need of grant assistance to those individuals during a most difficult part of their lives.
- 3. The Cancer Resource Alliance serves a broad spectrum of the community by providing grant assistance to any resident of Montezuma or Dolores counties regardless of age, gender, income, or type of cancer.
- 4. We believe the Cancer Resource Alliance is the only active provider of grants in Montezuma County to assist residents with a cancer diagnosis with both medical and non-medical expenses. Other organizations in our area which have provided similar services, i.e. Southwest Memorial Hospital Foundation Montelores Cancer Care Fund and the Clara Ormiston Cancer Treatment Fund, do not currently appear to be viable within Montezuma County (Dolores County still awards assistance under the Ormiston fund). The Cancer Resource Alliance, therefore, is the only organization actively seeking and granting funds to assist cancer patients in both Montezuma and Dolores Counties.
- 5. The Cancer Resource Alliance has an established relationship with the Women's Wellness Connection, a CDC instituted program which provides income and age eligible women who live in Colorado free breast and cervical cancer screenings. At this time, however, there are no WWC providers in Montezuma or Dolores counties. We collaborate

with the Cancer Coalition of Southwest Colorado centered in Durango which provides funds for cancer screening/treatment to patients in all southwest Colorado counties **except for Montezuma and Dolores (thus the impetus for the Cancer Resource Alliance to serve these patients).** Volunteers from the Cancer Coalition staff the American Cancer Society office at Mercy Hospital where they distribute OUR fund applications to cancer patients who live in our served counties. The Mercy Oncology Department also distributes our applications. The Cancer Resource Alliance distributes information about our program and applications to doctors within our area and Southwest Health Systems.

4. Describe the community support for your program.

Historically the primary fund raiser for the Cancer Resource Alliance has been the annual Pretty in Pink Fashion Show. The success of this event over the last 11 years illustrates the community support for our program. Since the inception of the Fashion Show in 2011 over \$120,000 has been donated to the Cancer Resource Alliance. These funds come from sponsorships of the event, attendees and private donors. We have averaged 225 attendees at the event and numerous sponsorships including dollar contributions and silent auction items have been contributed. Over the years the Cancer Resource Alliance has assisted hundreds of individuals: 33 in 2018, 41 in 2019, 43 in 2020, 58 in 2021, and 70 in 2022. Year to date we have already funded 66+ applicants and expect that 2023 grants will well exceed those in 2022. We consistently continue to receive applications. Although we plan to hold the 12th annual Pretty in Pink Fashion Show fundraiser, the success of the event is unknown at this time.

Community support is also evidenced by the success of last year's Round-Up campaign. This is a new fund raiser for CRA wherein residents are asked to "round-up" their purchase amount to the nearest dollar. The amount added to the purchase is then donated to CRA. Last year 10 businesses participated and over \$2000 was raised.

### 5. How will you evaluate the success of your organization or program?

The success of our program is evaluated by the number of applicants we are able to assist and our ability to increase the grant amounts to applicants. In 2022 we were able to increase grants to \$750. Currently our grants are \$600 to new applicants and \$300 to repeat applicants (although funding repeat applications has been suspended for the time being because of a shortage of funds). Our success will be measured by our ability to increase grants to \$750 and fund repeat applicants. Our success is also measured by our ability to provide grant funds to all qualified applicants in 2023, 2024 and beyond.

6. Please list other support provided to your organization by the Town of Mancos, Montezuma County, the State of Colorado, or the U.S. Government (if any).

CRA has not yet received any funding from the Town of Mancos, Montezuma County, State of Colorado, or the U.S. Government. However, in 2021 the City of Cortez granted us \$2500 through the Community Grant program for 2022 and granted \$4000 for 2023.

The Cortez Retail Enhancement (CREA) program provided radio advertising for our 2019 Pretty in Pink fundraiser and provided the same assistance in 2021, 2022 and 2023 (our Pretty in Pink fundraiser was not held in 2020 due to the COVID-19 pandemic). In 2022 CREA assisted with our new "round-up" campaign in which participating local businesses ask customers if they want to "round-up" their purchase as a donation to the Cancer Resource Alliance. CREA printed and mailed out flyers to Cortez businesses which described the mechanics of the program. In 2023 CREA will provide similar support and also advertise the "round-up" campaign in local and social media.

CRA applied for and received a \$2500 grant from the Ballantine Family Fund and a \$2500 grant from El Pomar.

### 1.A. Mission Statement

Community Connections, Inc. (CCI) is dedicated to the mission of creating opportunities for children and adults with intellectual and developmental disabilities to live healthy and fulfilling lives in our community.

### 1.B. Goals and Objectives

CCI's main goal is to achieve social integration for children and adults with intellectual and developmental disabilities in their communities. Our strategic priorities and objectives include:

### Priority 1: Improve opportunities for people with disabilities to engage.

Objectives: Educate people with intellectual and developmental disabilities about benefits of broadened engagement and opportunities; Increase transportation opportunities provided by paid or unpaid supports; Increase community employment and volunteering. Increase access to and appropriate use of technology that supports integration.

### **Priority 2: Increase community education and outreach.**

*Objectives: Increase engagement of community members with individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities; Equip employees and volunteers as community ambassadors.* 

### **Priority 3: Diversify and increase funding.**

*Objectives: Increase funding from sources other than Medicaid, State General Fund, and Part C Federal funds.* 

### **Priority 4: Improve processes and operations.**

*Objectives: Develop a robust program evaluation program; Implement accepted principles of Quality Improvement Strategies throughout the organization; Implement a coordinated, competency-based training program that covers all agency positions.* 

### 2.A. Purpose of requested funds:

With the Town of Mancos's support, in fiscal year 2023 (July 2022 – June 2023) CCI provided eligibility and enrollment, case management and direct services to 17 Mancos residents including:

- Essential early intervention therapies to 9 infants and toddlers with developmental delays or disabilities;
- Financial and case management support and targeted services to 5 families that prevented the need for costly and distressing out-of-home foster care placements;
- Community-based mentoring services ranging from vocational support to help with maintaining a home and managing money for 2 adults with significant intellectual disabilities; and
- Residential Services for 1 adult with disabilities, providing 24/7 essential services such as feeding and bathing 365 days/year.

CCI is the only organization providing comprehensive residential services, eligibility, enrollment, case management and other essential direct services to children and adults with intellectual and developmental disabilities like autism, Down syndrome and cerebral palsy within the Town of Mancos. Our cost of delivering these services continues to grow and reimbursements rates are not

keeping pace. Financial support from local municipalities and counties is critical to our effectiveness in all the communities we serve and to our ability to leverage additional financial support from other public and private funders.

For Fiscal Year 2024, we are requesting a contribution of \$1,500 from the Town of Mancos Board of Trustees to support partial unreimbursed personnel costs CCI incurs annually to deliver programs and services to Mancos residents with intellectual and developmental disabilities. This represents an investment of approximately \$88 per person/family served.

### 2.B. Where funds will be expended:

In FY2023, CCI served 17 children and adults (and their families) with the Town of Mancos (15% of the 109 people served in Montezuma County). In 2023, 100% of funding secured from the Town of Mancos would used to provide services to Mancos residents with intellectual and developmental disabilities.

### 2.C. Why it is critical you receive this funding?

CCI serves over 900 people each year with more than 400,000 hours of service across a five-county region. As the designated Community Centered Board (CCB) for our region, we provide case management, early intervention, and family support services. We also operate as a Program Approved Service Agency (PASA), offering a variety of direct services including residential services, in-home care, community access, employment support, transportation, and mentorship and coaching for independent living. By operating as both a CCB and PASA, we are able to respond to the needs of clients and caregivers in a holistic way – an advantage in rural Southwest Colorado where fewer care options exist. However, due to regulation changes at the state and federal level, these two branches of our organization must now be uncoupled. In the coming year, our organization will undergo a transition that will transform it into two separate entities. To accomplish this, CCI will remain the case management agency, early intervention, and family support services provider for the region. But because we are the only current IDD service provider for most counties in our region, we will also create a new, separate 501c3 nonprofit organization called Our Own Lives to continue providing all direct services.

During the next twelve months, we will be creating new leadership teams, strategic plans, organizational structures, missions, branding and marketing, websites, and organizational cultures for two organizations: both our legacy organization (CCI) and the new organization (OOL). The costs of these changes are extraordinary and are not funded by our normal revenue streams. Though our financial projections reflect long-term sustainability of each organizations, we need assistance with the up-front costs. Because we are dividing assets between the organizations and assuming the financial risks of start-up, it is not feasible to utilize our limited reserves for those costs. The Town of Mancos' continued investment in CCI at this critical time will ensure availability of critical supports, continuity of care, and sustained quality of services for people with disabilities in Southwest Colorado, now and into the future.

Ultimately, becoming two separate entities will not only address issues of federal compliance but allow us to expand capacity for the benefit of the people we serve. It opens the door to creating new programs that increase availability of services in a region that has been experiencing provider

shortages for years. While the transition creates short-term challenges, the positive impacts will be significant and lasting for Southwest Colorado's residents with disabilities.

## **3.** How will funding of your organization's activities meet the Board of Trustees funding priorities?

Funding will fulfill the Trustees' commitment to not-for-profit organizations that address a unique community need, avoid overlapping services and "to support community organizations that preserve or enrich the health, education, welfare and fitness of the community." In 2024, CCI will continue to provide Town of Mancos residents essential early intervention therapies for infants and toddlers; financial and case management support and targeted services for families; and community-based services that enable adults with intellectual and developmental disabilities to live as independently as possible in their own or their family's home.

### 4. Describe the community support for your organization or program?

Community Connections has been supporting Southwest Colorado residents with intellectual and developmental disabilities since 1985. The agency has a 39-year track record of providing excellent service delivery and securing modest cash and in-kind contributions from individuals, local businesses and governments, the United Way of Southwest Colorado, private foundations, corporate sponsors, Community Connections' board of directors, community partners and volunteers.

### 5. How will you evaluate the success of your organization or program?

The following outcomes continue to be the most effective means of assessing success and the benefits of our services to residents with intellectual and developmental disabilities:

- Hospitalization rate: reflecting the overall health of our clients;
- Percent of clients that have jobs of those who want jobs;
- The number of young children that increase their knowledge and skills by the time they leave our Early Intervention Program;
- Percent of families for whom Community Connections prevented an out-of-home placement of their child; and
- Staff turnover rate: reflecting our training and ability to maintain quality staff to provide essential services.

## 6. Please list other support provided to your organization by the Town of Mancos, Montezuma County, the State of Colorado, or the U.S. Government (if any).

In FY23 (ending 6/30/23): Town of Mancos - \$600, Montezuma County - \$10,000, State of Colorado - \$1,757,075, Medicaid - \$3,743,503. Approximately 90% of our funding comes from the State of Colorado and Medicaid, with roughly 10% comprised of grants and contributions.





### 2. Purpose, Geographic Area, And Critical Necessity of Funding

- A. *Purpose of Requested Funds:* The purpose of this grant proposal is to request funding to enhance and solidify the long-term sustainability of the recycling program, in Mancos, started in 2008, by the Four Corners Recycling Initiative.
  - i. Budget Items: The entirety of the awarded grant funds will be expended on bin

haul fees for the Mancos recycling site.

- B. *Geographic Location:* 100% of the funds will be directed into services being provided for the town of Mancos.
- C. *Why is it critical for FCRI to receive this funding?* Without the financial support from the town, FCRI will be unable to provide adequate recycling services to the community causing bin overflow. This overflow causes environmental contamination and is indicative of a regional opportunity and need to increase diversion. When the public encounters full and/or overflowing bins they either leave the cardboard near the bin which then contaminates nearby areas, or they throw the cardboard away.

#### 3. <u>How will funding of your organization's activities meet the Board of Trustees funding</u> priorities?

- A. FCRI's recycling program addresses a unique community need as rural communities, such as Mancos, struggle to provide recycling services due to the high costs of hauling long distances and the absence of infrastructure. Additionally, rural communities often struggle economically as industry tends to be centered in urban areas. Fortunately, FCRI's programming has a direct impact on the local economy as revenue comes into the local economy from the sale of the recycled commodities on the open market. Income received from the sale of these commodities will be coming into the community from an external source. This transaction effectively increases the money in circulation locally and as reinvestments are made, also increases the velocity of the money in the local economy. Another direct economic impact to the local community is job creation. One position has been created at the landfill in response to increased waste diversion. In fact, the formation of a new transport company that focuses strictly on transporting recyclables has been witnessed with five private business positions created as a direct result of FCRI's programs.
- B. The FCRI organization serves a broad spectrum of the community by providing non-denominational, apolitical, non-discriminatory, free, public recycling. That is to say, anyone can recycle, as much as they would like, whenever they would like, as often as they would like.
- C. FCRI is an organization that avoids providing overlapping services. In fact, there are no other recycling providers in the community.
- 4. Describe community Support for FCRI: This recycling program is a collaborative effort consisting of the local Mancos school district, private entities, and the Town of Mancos. This will be the tenth year of successfully diverting mixed paper, corrugated cardboard, and mixed metals from our local landfill. Additionally, this will be the third year of diverting type 1 & 2 plastics from the local landfill. If funded, this grant will enable the continued and expanded availability of waste diversion (recycling) services in Mancos and allow additional partners to become involved in the effort. Furthermore, for the last two years we have received generous support from Mancos residents, Fenceline Cidery, Alpacka Rafts and the Mancos Brewery, and for the last 5 years we have received funding from the Absolute Bakery to help promote recycling services in Mancos. We raised over \$1600 at the Mancos silent auction event (support from many businesses) last Dec. 2022 We have received \$2500 from the Town of Dolores for 2023, \$1500 from Dolores Schools, and \$1920 from Mancos schools. We are receiving some money from our website and facebook, small amounts monthly. \$14,145 from CDPHE rebate.

Mancos is double the hauling costs of Dolores annually at \$16640 since it's two bins once a week.

Thus, there is clear support and need for funding for recycling in Mancos.

- 5. How will we evaluate success? We will use the 2023 Montezuma county landfill workload statistics and the 2022-2023 program results as a baseline to measure results in absolute terms and identify trends or impacts from the waste diversion expansion. FCRI is currently averaging approximately 6-7 tons of recyclable material collections per month delivered in the bins collectively. We keep detailed records and track each bin individually from each of our locations. In addition, FCRI board members, the public, and the Mancos town board will observe the bin site to ensure reduced environmental contamination due to recyclable bin overflow.
- 6. <u>What other Governmental Support does FCRI receive?</u> FCRI submits grant applications to the state to pay for infrastructure improvements and expanded services annually. State grant awards are disbursed in August. FCRI relies largely on Colorado State recycling rebates to fund its programming.





### Mancos Gear Share

The Mancos Gear Share (MGS) is a nonprofit, community-sponsored project dedicated to creating opportunities for local families and youth to pursue healthy outdoor activities. We will achieve this vision by providing outdoor equipment, training on safe equipment use, and engaging outdoor programming at little to no cost to the users. The vision for this project has been designed to develop programs that engage local families and youth–ideally underserved families--in pursuing healthy outdoor activities without having the financial barrier of costly equipment, or the lack of knowledge about how to use it in a safe way.

In collaboration with the Mancos Valley Resources, the Mancos Public Library, the Town of Mancos, the Outdoors Empowered Network (OEN), and the Mancos School District, the MGS has accomplished most of its initial goals. The initial goals included establishing a comprehensive inventory of outdoor activity gear, acquiring a storage facility to house the gear, developing a website for users to learn about and register for membership in the MGS, and developing user software within our website for gear checkout/in. MGS conducted a "soft" opening at the Mancos farmers market on August 31st to begin promoting our program as officially open to the public, and our website is currently live at <a href="https://mancosgearshare.org/">https://mancosgearshare.org/</a>.

Currently, our goals have shifted to a more operational focus. Our goal now is to build a solid membership base that will generate revenue to sustain the MGS and to build community programming that utilizes the MGS inventory. Now that we are ready to begin creating memberships, lending out gear, and building programs that utilize the MGS inventory, our objective is to intensify our marketing strategy and establish a welcoming and functional meeting space for the MGS users and volunteers to work out of. We also plan to dedicate the time of the Mancos School District Social Worker and Student intern to establishing community outdoor programming, as an additional objective.

At this point in time, we find ourselves in need of more space. What we plan to do with the Agency Contribution funds, if they were to be awarded to MGS, would be it to contribute to the purchase of a functional 12'x14' or 14'x16' shed to serve as the "shop" for the MGS program in Cottonwood Park. Currently, our 20'x8' storage container is full of gear, which is a good problem to have, but it leaves us with no space to meet with MGS members, showcase available gear, clean/maintain gear, and prepare orders to be checked in & out.

Mancos Conservation District is submitting a grant application for staffing and a truck purchase to assist with forestry programs, chipper programs and data collection.

Attached is a draft letter of support for your review and decision.

On behalf of Town of Mancos, I would like to express my support for your application to the Forest Restoration and Wildfire Risk Mitigation Grant Program to hire additional capacity to assist the Mancos Conservation District's (MCD) Forestry Program in overseeing forestry projects on private lands, collecting and organizing GIS and spatial data, and running the chipper program. This capacity will also help ensure that forest crew activities comply with government and grant regulations and complete post implementation inspections.

In addition, I would like to express my support for MCD's proposed capacity funding for a truck purchase. This truck would be used by the proposed assistant to haul the chipper - already under MCD ownership - to post-treatment project areas where slash piles created by forest management will be chipped and either spread out or hauled off site to further reduce wildfire risks.

The focal area for this Grant is within the highest priority locations identified in the updated Montezuma County Community Wildfire Protection Plan and the priority area for Rocky Mountain Restoration Initiative (RMRI). The region includes Jackson Gulch and Summit Reservoirs, as well as Chicken Creek and Lost Canyon Creek, all of which play vital roles in the Mancos Watershed. If a severe wildfire were to occur in this area, post-fire run-off would significantly impact the community's water supply.

This forest health project will be like other forest health projects around the state dealing with comparable environmental variables that foster comparable decline. The difference with this project is that there are fewer options, due to socio-economic limitations, for landscape-scale treatment when dealing with commercially less-desirable communities and native species. Funding for private land forest stand improvement outside of defensible space zones is needed to round out resilience treatment opportunities in this critical target landscape.
